



AYAKO Methodology Variance Analysis

The Afonjas - Matrix Interpretation Report

This report demonstrates how the **AYAKO Matrix** translates structured relational inputs into clinically interpretable diagnostics. The analysis compares the couple's scores against established baseline averages and evaluates variance direction, magnitude, and distribution across relational domains.

1 Normal Variance Analysis

A. Communication Domain

- **Listening (-21 variance)** reflects a substantial underperformance relative to baseline.
- **Cooperation (-2)** and **Body Language (-0.5)** indicate mild deficits.
- **Voice Tone (+0.5)** shows slight strength.

Interpretation

There is a marked imbalance between expressive and receptive communication. While tone and surface expression may appear adequate, deep listening competence is significantly compromised. Within the AYAKO framework, this predicts emotional misattunement, misinterpretation of intent, and cumulative relational fatigue.

B. Conflict Management

- Collaborate (-15) severe deficit.

Bar Representation
